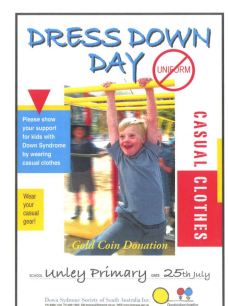

What is Down syndrome?

Down syndrome is a congenital chromosomal condition and is the most common cause of intellectual disability in Australia.
